

## TRIP HIGHLIGHTS

- See the migration of 10 million Straw-colored Flying Foxes in Kasanka National Park
- See Big Five plus numerous other mammals, reptiles and birds
- Help Zambian bat biologists with their studies
- Portion of trip fee donated to Bats Without Borders, Save the Bats and education efforts

## **ITINERARY**

Days 1-2: Spend two nights at scenic Pioneer Lodge and visit a local cave to see several bat species including Egyptian Fruit, Leaf-nosed, Horse-shoe and Long-fingered bats.

Day 3: Enjoy one night at Forest Inn where we look for rare species such as Lord Derby's scaly-tailed flying squirrel and birds.

Days 4-7: Head to Kasanka and stay in chalets at Wasa Camp. View the incredible emergence of Straw-colored Flying Fox at dusk as well as game including Sitagunga, antelope, hippo and more. Set nets to catch other bat species and see roosting bats.

Days 8-9: Fly to South Luangwa, the prime park in Zambia for big and small game species. Take safaris by day and search for bats at night, staying two nights at Wildlife Camp.

Days 10-11: Move to luxurious Mfuwe camp for the final two days of fantastic wildlife viewing including night drives and more bat studies.

Day 12: Fly back to Lusaka for a last night at Pioneer, where we started, and head home.
